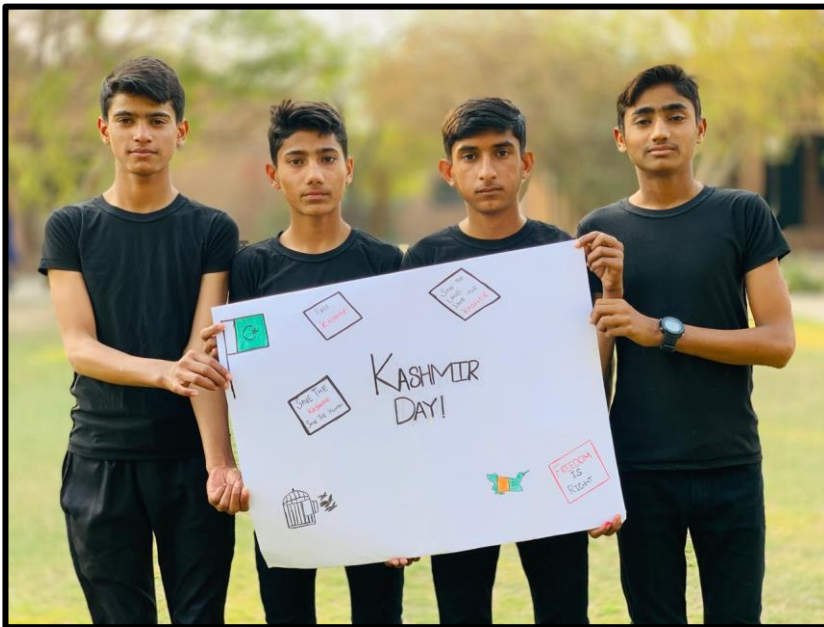

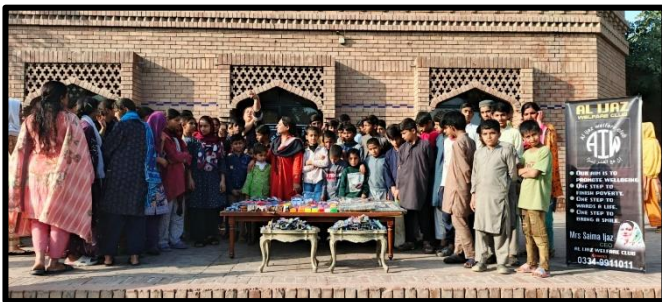
Art and Craft Club Activity:
